About a year ago, the Eastminster website began to take on a new look, helped along by a website provider (Site Organics) and a webmaster named Sean. Many of you will argue—and rightly so—that a website is only the beginning of the new forms of communicating. Blogs, Facebook, Twitter take what we do to another level, but a website's a start, right?

One of my favorite websites, hosted by Center for Church Communication, asks the question, "**We have the greatest story every told; why can't we communicate it?**" One answer is we fail to reach out to where the people are, and communicate how *they* communicate. Many people, young and old, are comfortable going online—so our website becomes a valuable tool in communicating His message.

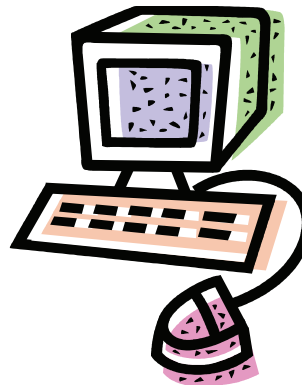
around, click on the various sub-pages, and give us your feedback.

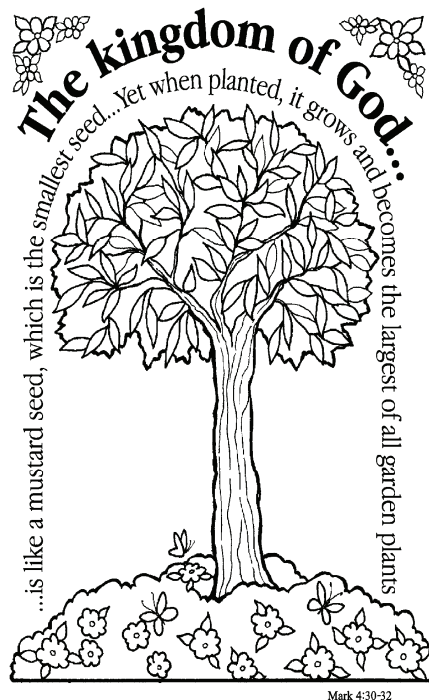

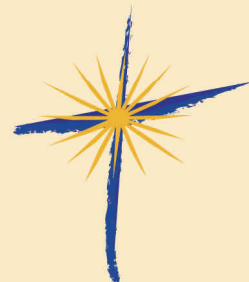

THE MISSIONARY IN EACH OF US

First, let me bring you some good news about our “2 cents per meal” offering taken during the last Sunday of each month. This offering goes to **PATH**, the **P**resbyterian **A**nswer **T**o **H**unger. In my May article, I asked you to support it earnestly. **YOU DID!** And, you raised the offering to \$733 in May, almost \$100 more than April and \$200 more than March! Last month, Eastminster’s Missions Ministry matched your June

contributions to continue providing food to those in need.

You may have heard about the **TORCH** Mission, the **T**raining **O**f **R**edeemed **C**hristians **H**eavenbound, in Honduras, Central America. Last month, they built a house near Tegucigalpa, using funds from Eastminster. We hope to have some pictures to share with you soon.

Recall also that your Easter offering was split between two mission families in Guatemala, the Logans and the Rices. They’ve expressed their gratitude for our support, which maintains their meager church dwellings and brings physical and spiritual nourishment to the elderly and youth in their communities. The work is never-ending, yet they do it without complaint each day. The Rices have been in Guatemala on mission for over nine years and their daughter, Bryony, recently graduated from the Christian Academy of Guatemala, an American-run school for missionary children. For their graduation ceremony, the students chose the following verse: **“But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength, they will soar on the wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary; they will walk and not be faint.” (Isaiah 40:31).** May we, like them, run and not grow weary of helping those less fortunate. God bless each of you in your support of the missions ministry of Eastminster.

On a related note...

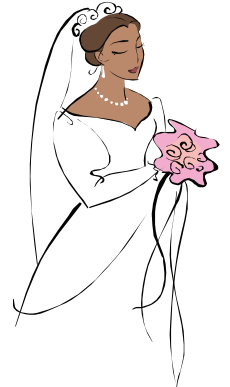
Ann Warden has brought to the attention of the Missions Ministry Team a wonderful opportunity for individuals in our church and our community, called **“Hearts Out to Haiti,”** overseen locally by Wanda Cordelli. *Here is her story:*

“My name is Wanda Cordelli, I am a Beggar and Buyer for the Hearts Out to Haiti Mission. We have 3 adopted parishes in Haiti and our number one mission is education for the children, but we also take up other missions that support the families, when the Spirit calls us.

One of the calls was our help in obtaining donated pre-worn wedding gowns so we can establish a **‘wedding gown loan closet.’** in the rectory for future parish brides. The ladies in these small mountain villages cannot get married until they have a white dress to wear, something that is an absolute luxury, not obtainable in these mountain villages. The ‘wedding gown loan closet’ allows them to do work around the parish to earn the use of a gown for their wedding day and then return it to the loan closet for the next bride. December in Haiti is like ‘June Brides’ in the U.S., so we are collecting gowns now to fill the ‘loan closet.’

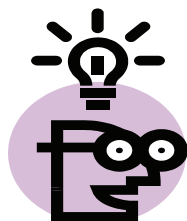
Each bride also receives a Bible in Creole, which we purchase in Haiti for \$2.00 U.S. and then have beautifully decorated with ribbon and flowers by the women in the villages. Traditionally the women get to ride a mule on their wedding day to church; at all other times they must walk, carrying food and water on their heads.

Please think of the delight your retired wedding gown can bring to a bride in Haiti. What a blessing to know that your gown can again create joy by helping to unite a loving Haitian couple. DISCIPLE

We plan to start a Disciple I and a Disciple IV class in August. Are you interested?

A class will be forming in August for two of the 4-part series of Disciple courses, *Becoming Disciples Through Bible Study* (Disciple I), as well as *Under the Tree of Life* (IV). Each course is a 34-week study, and will, in four parts, cover the whole Bible, from Genesis through Revelation, emphasizing daily scripture reading and featuring weekly group sessions. Each course contains a video component with presentations by pastors, teachers and scholars to aid in understanding the Scriptures. This study was developed for people who are hungry for the Word of God, for prayer and study, and for a sense of community within the church. We hope to have, at the end, Biblically-nourished persons committed to live as Disciples of Jesus Christ.

We have scheduled a Disciple orientation meeting for **Wed., August 19**, at 6:30 pm in the upstairs Meeting Room. The class will decide the meeting day and time. If we have enough people interested, we would consider having both an evening and morning class each week. Course information may be obtained from Syd Freese (723-8371) or from Ken Wall (777-3495).
