The History of The Month of Prayer at New Life Church

2016 marks the fifteenth consecutive year that New Life Church has dedicated the month of August to prayer.

It all started in 2002 with a 21-day adventure, designed to help us establish the habit of prayer in our personal and corporate lives. Each person in the congregation was asked to select a prayer partner and make a covenant to pray together for twenty-one days. A devotional guide covering different aspects of prayer was provided to help maintain focus and ensure success. In addition, various corporate prayer meetings were held to reinforce in us a lifestyle of prayer.

The church embraced the concept wholeheartedly and grew in prayer significantly. This led to what we now call "The Month of Prayer," which is observed annually during the month of August. Other church programs are set aside to help the church make prayer a priority.

Diane also serves as an associate professor at the Regent University School of Divinity where she teaches and mentors graduate and doctoral students.
