## **Snagit: the screen capture and editing program**

This is what I use to capture, crop and edit images for all the PowerPoint presentations I create for all my training materials. I LOVE this little program!

## **Camtasia: the program that captures onscreen images and audio**

This software is made by the same company that makes Snagit—it is actually an advanced screen capture program that captures all your actions and your voice on the screen. The website has great demos, tutorials.

## **TuneConvert: the software that turns a video file into an audio file with one click**

This software does a lot of other things, but I just use it for this one task which it does super easily and quickly.

### **VideoPress: hosting system for videos**

This is a system created by WordPress. You need a free WordPress.com site to host your videos (but you don't have to do anything else with the site or even make it public). That site generates a shortcode that you copy and paste into whatever site you want to show your video on.

[www.videopress.com](http://www.videopress.com) for information. Costs about \$60 a year, plus cost of space upgrade (starting at \$19.95.) Really very reasonable for private video hosting.

### **Viddler: this is the site that hosts the videos that link to my ECC training site.**

Though Viddler has a public option similar to YouTube, if you want to use the site for profit purposes and to have your videos private (meaning they only show up on your site to people you give permission to), you need their Business option.

[www.viddler.com](http://www.viddler.com) Business options starts at \$100 a month, plus additional hosting and bandwidth costs if you go over base amount.

### **GoToWebinar: webinar production company**

This is the site I use to create my webinars. You don't need to do anything except have a PowerPoint or other demonstration (such as a live website) ready to go to do a webinar. SUPER simple to set up and do. Disappointments in how they record videos and some sound issues, but for basic webinar creation, I am very happy with them.

[www.GoToWebinar.com](http://www.GoToWebinar.com) base cost for webinars (they have a number of pricing options) is \$99 a month for up to 100 attendees at a time, though you may do as many as you want.

### **LULU: site that produces CDs, etc.**

I forgot to talk about this one in detail during the webinar, but this is another company I LOVE. With it you can create CDs, DVDs, e-books, paperback books, any and all of the resources to help folks learn what you teach. There is NO upfront cost to use LULU. They are a print-on-demand company and take out their cut when you purchase something.
