
Fire Escape Preparation Plans and Instructions

Firecard Notes

General notes

- Cards show revised scheme that letters rooms/parts of church and numbers the waiting areas outside in a counterclockwise pattern, starting from the sanctuary. [This way an usher assigned to be in charge of each waiting area could know/have a list of all church rooms (by letter) assigned to that area.]
- Evacuation routes are color-coordinated to each waiting area (only exception is sections A and C in the sanctuary, which both go to area 1 but are done in two shades of blue to differentiate them.
- Secondary routes are shown with dotted lines where applicable. (Not all primary routes have a secondary one.)
- Cards for pews were kept to a half-page size (the one for section D will have to be a folded card; this stock too thick?); evacuation title always at the top to attract attention to card in the pew racks.
- Orientation: We originally had these all oriented in the same direction, and I realized that they needed to be oriented to the way folks would be looking at them, such as from the pews rather than from the altar. I tried to orient all the other layouts to the door that will be used for evacuation, assuming each card will be posted somewhere close to that door. If sideways, I just turned the "You are here" toward that door or if upside-down, I turned around the whole layout. In several places I provided more than one orientation (balcony, fellowship hall) for cards that could be posted in different places or used in different ways. They need to make sense according to where each will be posted or used.
