The Gospel is the good news of salvation in Jesus.

For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. John 3:16, KJV

And this is the testimony: God has given us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life.

1 John 5: 11-12, NIV

We neither make nor save ourselves. God does both the making and saving. He creates each of us by Christ Jesus to join him in the work he does, the good work he has gotten ready for us to do, work we had better be doing. Eph 2: 8-9, MSG "This is how much God loved the world: He gave his Son, his one and only Son. God didn't go to all the trouble of sending his Son merely to point an accusing finger, telling the world how bad it was. He came to help, to put the world right again.



- It can explain what you don't have time to in the sermon.
- It can clarify that your church is about more than activities,
 offerings, and nice people on Sunday.
- They can take it home, read it over, go to the websites, and social media you have listed to find out more.
- It can invite people to interact with the church staff about what it means to come to know Jesus as Savior.


ONE MORE THING.

This short presentation in the Bulletin is not the only thing we need to do to help people come to know Jesus as Savior and to grow to mature disciples, BUT it does:



- **Lay a correct foundation—no bait and switch later.
- **Defines who we are—a church that cares about truth, Jesus, eternity.
- **Start a conversation we can continue in person or via social media.



Note how the section "How do I grow as a Christian?" both tells people there is more to becoming a Christian than a quick decision and also shows how once you become a Christian it all fits into the overall life of the church.



There are two good things here—first of all the acknowledgement that it is not a formula, but a start in the Christian life. Second, it also encouraging people if they are starting the journey to let the staff know. It would have been even better to have names and contact information right there. It is so easy to assume everyone knows how to contact the staff, but they usually don't, so make it clear.


Do you want Christ in your life?

There's no magic formula, but if you can sincerely take these steps, it will be a great start.


- 1. Confess your sin to God, knowing that it separates you from him. Sin is not just wrong actions, but living without God as the center of your life.
- 2. Ask God to forgive your sins, realizing you cannot fix this problem yourself.
- Trust that Jesus died on the cross to pay for your sins and rose from the dead to offer you eternal life.
- 4. **S**erve Jesus as the leader of your life. That means a life in community with other Christ-followers of loving God, loving each other, and loving our neighbors.

Call it the "CATS" plan if it helps you remember. It's not magic, but it can help you start the journey.

If you are just starting the journey, let one of our staff know. We'd love to celebrate and walk alongside you.



A wonderfully positive, upbeat way to share what it means to be a Christian! It seems like it takes a lot of space, when you look at the excerpt alone—but look at the layout of the bulletin below. It was a tri-fold 11x17 and the gospel presentation only takes up part of one section.

Did You Know?

God loves you and created you to know Him. Jesus says, "For God so loved the world that He gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him, shall not perish but have eternal life." (John 3:16)

But there is a problem. Man is sinful and separated from God, so we cannot know Him personally or experience His love. "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23).

There is a solution. Sin affects us so much we won't seek God on our own. Therefore God takes the initiative and draws us to His Son Jesus Christ – who is the only way to the Father. (John 14:6). "God demonstrates His own love towards us, in that while we were yet sinners. Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8).

Yet, it is not enough simply to affirm these truths...

We must each receive Jesus Christ as Saviour and Lord; then we can know God personally and experience His love.

The Bible says, 'That if you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved" (Romans 10:9-10).

You are invited to begin your relationship with Jesus Christ today. You can express your faith in Christ through prayer.



Because the Chapel Service doesn't have to pass on much of the information of regular churches, it emphasizes the most important thing—God's plan of salvation.

WHAT IS GOD'S PLAN?

He does have a plan for us...

Jeremiah 29:11 tells us God indeed does have a plan for us, a plan to give us a future and a hope, not one to harm us. The only problem is we are separated from God by sin. The first man, Adam, disobeyed God and that brought sin into the world. Every human born since Adam, has been naturally born into a life of sin. That is a life of selfishness, pride, greed and self-centeredness.

All men are separated from God...

Romans 3:23, says every human being has gone their own way and done things against God's law. The Ten Commandments were given to men to show their lives were indeed sinful. Without the "Law" there could be no repentance. Jesus came to "fulfill" the Law and draw the world unto Himself.

Man tries to get back to God

Proverbs14:12 "Before every man, there lies a wide and pleasant road that seems right but ends in death." Isaiah 59:2 "But the trouble is that your sins have cut you off from God. Because of sin He has turned His face away from you and will not listen any more." God didn't create robots that loved Him automatically, He wants us to come to Him willingly, on our own, by faith. Getting back to God can only be done by something He provided, nothing we could do would ever be enough.

God's provision and "way" for us

John 3:16-17 "For God loved the world so much that He gave His only Son so that anyone who believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life." "God sent His Son into the world to save it." John 14:6 "Jesus told him, 'I am the way—yes, the truth and the life. No one can get to the Father except by means of me." Jesus is the only way to a "re-united relationship" with God, He is the only way to heaven, and indeed, He is the only one who grants forgiveness, through repentance.

He hears a "sincere" heart.

Romans 10:9-10 "For if you tell others with your own mouth that Jesus Christ is your Lord, and believe in your own heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved, for it is by believing in his heart that a man becomes right with God; and with his mouth he tells others of his faith, confirming his salvation. Romans 10:13 "Anyone who calls upon the name of the Lord will be saved." John 1:12 "...but to all who received Him, He gave the right to become the children of God. When we confess our pride and selfishness, repent of our (sin), and trust Him to save us, we are His forever!

The Most

Important Thing

The most important thing you can discover is that God loves you and offers eternal life.

What do you think God requires for a person to have eternal life?

You can know God loves you because of the cross.

The reason Christ died is for sin.

"For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous (Jesus) for the unrighteous (us) to bring you to God. For all have sinned and fallen short of God's glory" (2 Peter 3:18a; Romans 3:23)

All people are guilty of sin and in need of a Savior!

"God made Him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God" (2 Corinthians 5:21)

Jesus is our substitute, He is the only one who can offer salvation. Salvation includes forgiveness of sin and the gift of eternal life. How is this possible? To have forgiveness and eternal life, you must believe and receive.

<u>Believe</u> that Jesus is Lord and that He rose again from the dead. "That if you confess with your mouth, that Jesus is Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved" (Romans 10:9)

Receive Christ in faith trusting Him alone for salvation. The Bible says, "...To all who receive Him, to those who believe in His name, He gave the right to become children of God" (John 1:12)

God paid for your sins through the death of His Son Jesus. Will you trust Him as your Savior?

Did you receive Jesus as your Savior?



The Romans Road

Romans 3:10 — As the Scriptures say, "No one is righteous—not even one.

Romans 3:23 — "For all have sinned, and fall short of the glory of God."

Romans 5:8 — "But God demonstrates His love toward us, in that, while we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

Romans 6:23 — "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Romans 10:9 — "That if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved.

Romans 10:13 — "For whoever calls on the name of the LORD shall be saved."

Would you like to follow the Romans Road to salvation? If so, here is a simple prayer you can pray to God. Saying this prayer is a way to declare to God that you are relying on Jesus Christ for your salvation.

The words themselves will not save you.

Only faith in Jesus Christ can provide salvation!

"God, I know that I have sinned against you and am deserving of punishment. But Jesus Christ took the punishment that I deserve so that through faith in Him I could be forgiven. With your help, I place my trust in You for salvation. Thank You for Your wonderful grace and forgiveness - the gift of eternal life! Amen!"

The educational approach is to offer historically accurate material and to portray Jesus in a manner that is of most relevance to the audience. Upon studying material of the JesusCentral.com, one should at least have an accurate, basic understanding of Jesus' core message, Jesus' self-stated purpose, who Jesus claimed to be, why Jesus was controversial and executed, and what caused such a massive following of Jesus, significantly impacting Western Civilization.

www.equip.org: this is the website of the Christian Research Institute and Hank Hanegraff, the Bible Answer Man. Though this site is a goldmine to find in-depth and well-researched answers on the Christian faith they are not easy to find. You have to go to the bottom left corner of the home page, and type in a topic or click on the Topical Index which will take you to a list of their great, free articles. Search around on the site, it is worth it.

www.whoisjesus-really.com: great site to explore the basics and more about Jesus.

www.ivpress.com/questioningfaith/resources: great list of topics/ questions of all sorts about the Christian faith with links to answers.

www.rbc.org: Though a lot of this website is for people who are already Christians, click on their "10 Reasons to Believe Section" good, clear explanations about the Christian faith.

At Christmas we focus on the baby in the manger, the angels' praise, and the shepherds' worship, but there is much more to this story.

The angels' praise and the shepherds' worship weren't solely for a cute baby with a touching back-story about his parent's struggles that brought them into a barn for their baby's birth.

The praise and worship were for the fulfillment of centuries of prophetic promises. Though their words were often dimly understood and often misinterpreted, the prophets' consistent message was that God had not abandoned a world that had turned its back on Him.

The praise and worship were because the temple sacrifices of thousands of innocent lambs would cease now that the redemption they represented had come to earth. Immanuel, "God with us" was no longer a vague promise, but a baby in the manger. The redemption He would purchase with this death on the cross would pay our sin debt in full.

The praise and worship were for what that baby would become: a teacher, healer, and ultimately the Savior of humanity.

The praise and worship were because that baby was living proof that someday, anyone and everyone, no matter what their past, if they accept the salvation the Savior would offer, could walk with God in peace, full of joy, and forever.



Even if you can't come to church, please remember that the message of Christmas is that God came to earth in the form of a person—Jesus of Nazareth. Jesus grew up not only to become the greatest teacher and miracle worker the world had ever seen, but to die a unique death.

In His death, Jesus was not a victim of evil men. Jesus willingly gave up His life and died on the cross so that He could pay the penalty for our sins.

The story doesn't end with HIs death. Jesus rose from the dead and demonstrated that He was God.

When we believe that Jesus died for our sins and we accept the forgiveness He offers us, and decide to follow Him, Jesus promises to give us eternal life.

If you'd like your sins forgiven; if you'd like to be at peace with your God; if you'd like to live forever, tell Jesus you are a sinner and you need His salvation. Ask Him to come into your life to be your Savior and Lord.

After you do that, please read the Bible to learn how to live as a Christian. Talk to God daily in prayer. Go to a church and get to know other followers of Jesus and grow in your faith.

At Westminster Presbyterian, we are here to help you find out about God and to grow as a Christian.

The example to the left here was used on a postcard inviting people to a Christmas series of sermons and a candlelight service.

The example below came out of a church bulletin.

It doesn't take much space to share our most important message.

Are you sure of your relationship with God?

You can be if you follow God's instructions on how to have a right relationship with Him. Here is what to do:

- 1. Admit that you have rebelled by not following God's perfect law (Romans 3:23; I John 1:9).
- Believe that Jesus is God's only son, and that his death and resurrection is the only possible payment for your rebellion (John 3:16; Romans 3: 23-26).
- 3. Ask Jesus to take the penalty for your rebellious actions (sins) so that you can be declared right with God (Romans 10:9; John 1:12).
- 4. Commit to place God first in your life by studying and obeying God's truth in the Holy Bible (I Timothy 3:16,17).

In order to have a right relationship with God, pray through the steps above and then commit yourself to grow in your new Christian life by daily talking to God in prayer and reading the Bible.

Some useful verses

Create your own! Below are some summary Bible verses that outline God's plan of salvation.

Humanity's situation:

Romans 3:23 For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.

Hebrews 9: 27 Just as man is destined to die once, and after that to face judgment.

God's solution

John 3:16 For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son,[1] that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.

Romans 6:23 For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in[1] Christ Jesus our Lord.

How to respond:

John 1:12 Yet to all who received him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God

Romans 10: 9 If you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.

God's promise:

1 John 5:11And this is the testimony: God has given us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. 12He who has the Son has life; he who does not have the Son of God does not have life. 13 I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God so that you may know that you have eternal life.

Revelation 3:20 [Jesus is speaking] Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with him, and he with me.

HOW TO BECOME A CHRISTIAN

Below is a brief summary of how a person becomes a Christian. Study each of the Scriptures in your Bible.

- You are a sinner. Romans 3:10, 23
- Your sint separate you from God. Romans 6:23a: Isaiah 59:2
- God loves you & Jesus died for you, Isaiah 53:4-6; John 3:16; Luke 19:10; Rom. 5:8-10
- You must receive Jesus as your Lord and Savier, John 1:11-13

HOW TO RECEIVE JESUS AS YOUR LORD AND SAVIOR

- Believe in Jesus John 3:16; Acts 16:31; Ephesians 2:8-10. (Belief is faith, trust, dependence, reliance upon Jesus alone for your salvation.)
- Repent of your sins. Luke 13:3;
 Acts 17:30-31; II Peter 3:9
 (Repentance is a change of the mind caused by a sorrow for sin & leading to a reformation of life.)
- Confess Jesus before men. Matthew 10:32-33; 16:15-16; Romans 10:9-10 (Confession is a public acknowledgement of your faith in Jesus.)
- Be baptized into Christ, Mark 16:15-16; Acts 2:38; Romans 6:3-5; I Peter 3:21 (Baptism is immersion in water of a repentant believer in Jesus)
- 5. Live a Christian life. Acts 2:42; Matthew 6:33; Revelation 2:10b (Christian living is allowing Jesus to control your everyday life.)

HOW TO GROW AS A CHRISTIAN

Once a person becomes a Christian, he begins a process of spiritual growth that will continue the rest of his life. One verse of Scripture gives a good summary of how the early Christians grew in their faith. Read Acts 2:42.

- Bible Study. They listened to, studied and obeyed what the apostles taught. For us, that means we should read, study and obey the Bible, especially the New Testament.
- Fellowship. The Bible word for fellowship means "sharing". They shared together with other Christians in times of public worship and study. They shared their material possessions in support of the church and the poor. They shared their lives with one another.
- Communion. They partook of the Lord's Supper on a regular basis (at least weekly). This reminded them that Jesus died for them.
- Prayer. They communicated with God concerning every area of their lives.

If you obey God's plan of salvation presented under "How To Become a Christian" at this church you automatically become a member unless you request otherwise. If you have already obeyed the plan of salvation, all you have to do is express your desire to be a member.



- 1. The most important message of our church is *the Gospel*, the good news of how to find salvation in Jesus.
- 2. The church bulletin is an ideal place to begin the conversation about it.
- 3. Each of your churches can express it in your own way, but whatever you do, do something!
- 4. Continue the conversation via social media links, web resources to explore, and personal contacts.
- 5. Pray God will use what you create to change lives for eternity!
